

Jolly Phonics uses the synthetic phonics method, which means that the letter sounds are taught first, on their own. Children are then taught to blend sounds together to say ('synthesise') the word.

There are five basic skills for reading and writing, each of which are incorporated within the Jolly Phonics program.

5 Key Skills of Jolly Phonics

Learning the letter sounds

Children are taught to identify the 42 main letter sounds. This includes alphabet sounds and digraphs, such as /sh/, /th/, /ai/ and /ue/.

Learning letter formation

Using different multi-sensory methods, children learn how to form and write the letters.

Blending

Children are taught how to blend the sounds together to read and write new words.

Identifying the sounds in words

Listening for the sounds in words gives children the best start for improving spelling.

Learning tricky words


Tricky words have irregular spellings and children learn these separately.

Daily Phonics Lessons Children continue to refine and extend their earlier phonics knowledge with each year providing:

Jolly Phonics Teacher's Book

The Jolly Phonics Teacher's Book contains a set of structured daily lesson plans, which correspond to the daily activities in the Jolly Phonics Student Books. The sample lesson plan below is for the letter sound /r/.

It contains all the information the teacher needs to deliver their lesson, from introducing the letter sound, a variety of multi-sensory methods to practice blending, as well as segmenting practice and further activity ideas.

Letter Sound /r/

· Review some of the sounds already taught: /s/, /a/, /t/, /i/, /p/, /n/, /c/, /k/, /e/, /h/.

Introducing the letter sound

· Introduce the sound /r/. Use a story such as the one below, along with the action:

Robert's family has a new puppy. They have to choose a name for him. Robert's parents like Rover, but Robert also likes Ben. Robert can't decide! He goes up to his bedroom with the puppy to fetch his roller skates. While Robert looks for them, the puppy explores the bedroom. Suddenly, Robert hears a low growling noise: "rrrrrr!" The puppy has found a blanket and is shaking it from side to side. Robert gets hold of the blanket and tries to pull it away, but the puppy hangs on tightly, going, "rrrrrr!" Finally, the blanket rips. "Oh dear," says Robert, holding the blanket up. "This looks like a rag now. I know, we'll call you Rags!"

· The students shake their heads, like a puppy with a rag, making a continuous /rrrrrr/ sound.

Letter formation

- · Explain how the letter for /r/ is written.
- The students practice writing (r), (p), (n), (c), (k), (e), and (h) in their books. They write over the dotted letters and then try again using the starting dots.
- Blending
 - · Show the students the words rip, rat, rest, and tree in their books.
 - · Say the sounds with the students, and then blend the sounds together to read the word. · Encourage the students to point to the dot underneath
 - each sound as they say it.

Identifying the sounds

- Ask the students to look at the four pictures at bottom of the lesson page.
- · Say the word for each picture. The students listen and write the letter for the first sound in each one [rain, rabbit, hen, rocket].

ran, rap, rat, rip, rack, rest, risk, trap, trek, trip, crack, track, crept, crisp, scrap, strap

- rip rat rest trap
- · Call out the word ran and say the sounds, holding up a finger for each one: /r-a-n/.
- Now ask the students to say the sounds. Write the letters on the board as they do so.
- · Blend the sounds with the class to read the word. Repeat with some of the other words.
- · Use the word bank regularly to practice blending.

Listen and write

- Call out the sound /r/, as well as some of the previous sounds. Ask the students to write the letter for each
- · Say the words rip and rat. The students listen for the sounds and write the words.

Further ideas

- Sing the /r/ song from Jolly Songs and pin up the /r/ section of the Wall Frieze.
- · Make model rabbits from modeling clay.
- · Paint pictures of rockets.
- · Make dog collages with pieces of rag.

The corresponding sound sheet from the Student Book.

10. Dictation

Dictating words from the sound sheet and word banks to practice segmenting. reinforce the new letter sounds.

Accompanying the Jolly Phonics Teacher's Book are the Jolly Phonics Student Books. The sample sound sheet below is for the letter sound /r/ from Student Book 1. (Student Books 2 and 3 follow – all three are covered in the Teacher's Book.)

The sound sheet provides children with the opportunity to practice both blending and letter formation, whilst the inclusion of the action allows children to gradually build up a bank of all the letter sounds.





Jolly Phonics for the Whiteboard


After a quick revision of previous letter sounds, and the introduction of the new letter sound /r/, children are given the opportunity to see and practice the letter formation.

There are then multiple activities, which can be done as a class on the whiteboard, and printed for individual use later, to reinforce learning. All of these slides are supported by printable teacher notes so that the lesson is easily planned!

8. Letter Formation Practice

One of multiple slides to practice letter formation.
The children can watch how the letter should be correctly formed, before taking it in turns to practice in front of the class on the whiteboard.

10. Teacher's Help

Accessed by pressing the blue icon in the right corner of the screen, these are available for every slide to explain the objective of each slide. These are printable, either individually or for all slides, to help the teacher easily prepare the lesson.

9. Class Activity

One of multiple slides of activities for the class to play. This fun game keeps multiple children - who can play at the same time - engaged, providing a fantastic opportunity to practice the new letter sound whilst revising previously learnt sounds.

11. Printable Worksheets

1. Lesson Objective

7. Word Bank

A selection of simple words that children can now practice blending, revising their knowledge of previously learnt letter sounds.

- 1 Letter Sound: /r/
- 2 Storyline: A boy has a playful puppy. The puppy finds an old blanket. He grips it in his teeth and shakes it from side to side. The boy grabs the blanket, but the puppy hangs on tightly, going, /rrrrrrrrr/. The blanket rips! It looks like a rag now, so the boy calls his puppy 'Rags'.
- 3 Action: The children pretend to be the puppy with its blanket, making a continuous /rrrrrrrrr/ sound.
- 4 Flash card: Hold up the letter a, and say /r/.
- 5 Letter formation: Explain how the letter sound is written. The children form the letter in the air. Then they trace the dotted letters on the Sound Sheet. Finally, they write the letters on their own.
- 6 Blending: The children blend the words on the Sound Sheet, pointing to the dot underneath each sound as they say it.
- 7 Word bank: Rat, rap, rest, trap, trip, strap, trick, crack, strict, cricket.
- 8 Extension activity: Paint a rocket picture, or make a rabbit from modelling clay.

Jolly Phonics Handbook

As well as the page for teachers, each letter sound in the Jolly Phonics Handbook is accompanied by a sound sheet that can be photocopied for every child in the class. The sample sound sheet below is for the letter sound /r/.



Additional Classroom Resources

We also have lots of excellent supplemental resources which can be used to further consolidate children's learning.




Picture Flashcards: On one side of the flashcard is the letter sound /r/ with a simple word written underneath that contains this letter sound. On the reverse of the card is a picture relating to the word, with dots which indicate the number of sounds in the word

Jolly Phonics Cards: includes a flashcard with the letter sound /r/ as well as many regular word blending cards that contain this letter sound. It also includes flashcards with alternative vowel spellings and tricky words.

Jolly Phonics Workbooks

The workbook has a full page on the letter sound /r/ which includes a shortened version of the story to introduce the action - which is also included at the bottom with a description - along with an accompanying picture. On the adjacent page there are several activities including letter formation practice and words to blend.

In total, there are 7 workbooks covering all of the 42 letter sounds, including alternative spellings of vowels.

These exciting decodable word and reading books use words that are within reach of the children, using their letter sound knowledge and tricky words already taught. They are progressive, with each level building on the previous and gradually introducing more tricky words and the main alternative vowel spellings.

In total, there are 149 readers across all the levels, each containing enchanting stories along with tips and advice for teachers and parents.

Additional Classroom Resources

Jolly Songs



(Tune: The Muffin Man Track 10)

See my puppy rip the rag, when he pulls so hard.

Action: Pretend to be a puppy pulling a rag, and shake your heaf from side to side, saying, rrrrrr

The CD allows children to hear the song for the letter sound /r/. In the book, there are lyrics to the song to go along with the accompanying picture and the action. Children can learn the lyrics to sing along with the CD, as well as doing the action, to create multiple ways of learning the new letter sound. (Also available as an App for Apple and Android devices.)

In total, the book has a song for each of the 42 letter sounds, as well as several games and activities.

Finger Phonics Books

This double page spread has a picture to introduce the letter sound /r/, as well as displaying the storyline and action. The big books are perfect for use with the whole class to introduce the sound and action.

The letter sound formation on the smaller, board book is embossed, allowing each child to easily feel how to correctly form this letter sound.

Each Finger Phonics book covers a different phase of letter sounds.
